Presidential Address

Annual Academic Sessions 2017, Sri Lanka College of Radiologists

Achieving Excellence in Radiological Care

Dr. Shanthini Rosairo

"My Presidential Address focuses on the theme of the year "Achieving Excellence in Radiological Care", some insights in to the current practice of Radiology and some projections and thoughts on the future of Radiology in Sri Lanka.

As members of the College of Radiologists we are committed to achieving excellence in Radiological care for patients by providing the highest quality medical imaging services in a caring and compassionate manner. Radiology departments nationwide, have undergone tremendous change. During my career there has been an exponential growth in advanced imaging technology with concomitant development of image-guided interventions and therapies. Radiology expertise has become essential in working with our clinical colleagues to diagnose, treat, and care for our patients. Achieving excellence in radiological care requires clinical, technological, research and academic excellence.

Clinical excellence is achieved by providing highest quality advanced imaging services, providing outstanding patient care and committing ourselves to academic excellence. The number of Radiologists required for the existing population is important in providing excellence in care. The demand for radiology services in Sri Lanka is on the rise. This has led to higher work load per Radiologist in Sri Lanka compared to our peers in other countries. High standards of Radiology cannot be compromised for the shortage of Radiologists. It is imperative that we identify strategies to improve the radiologist to patient ratio in Sri Lanka which is currently about one radiologist per 170,000 population. The Sri Lanka College of Radiologists expects to work in harmony with the ministry of health, the post graduate institute of medicine and the board of study in radiology in finding a solution to this glaring deficiency. The existing cadre of Radiologists in the government sector at present is 117. The projected cadre of

Radiologists to fill all the approved stations until the year 2025 is 185. This cadre is awaiting approval in view of the needs of the country.

The SLCR is happy to note the introduction of subspecialty training programs on paediatric radiology, interventional radiology, and neuroradiology by the PGIM at the post MD level in 2016 and 2017. This will provide state of the art radiological care and services to our patients and referring physicians utilizing cutting-edge imaging technology and application of innovative interventional therapies in the subspecialties. The SLCR is concerned about the non-availability of some subspecialties such as cardiothoracic care. It is imperative that we persevere with the Ministry of Health and the Post Graduate Institute of Medicine to rectify these deficiencies and establish subspecialty training programs to produce experts in such fields.

Radiological technological excellence is achieved by an adequate number of radiological technologists with knowledge and commitment, adequate radiological equipment and advanced state of the art technologies. The existing cadre of radiological technologists is 536 in the government sector. The tentatively anticipated projected cadre of until the year 2025 is being prepared according to the proposed number of equipment. Radiological technologists are trained by the school of Radiography from the year 1957. A BSc degree in Radiography was introduced at University of Peradeniya in 2006 and at Kothalawala defence university in 2013.

SLCR expects to play a pivotal role in the island wide distribution of radiological equipment with advanced technologies based on rational guidelines. The SLCR is persuading the Ministry of Health to appoint Radiologists to interventional units of all Teaching Hospitals and to provide training for enhanced performance. This is particularly important for the efficient use of healthcare services with better patient comfort. The transition from the analogue to digital systems has already started in Sri Lanka and the conventional radiography machines are being gradually replaced by computerized radiography and digital radiography systems, island wide.

With the assistance of the ministry of health, the SLCR is also committed to improving the work environment of radiologists by introducing the picture archiving and communicating system (PACS) to hospitals in Sri Lanka. The Ministry of Health is planning to introduce the PACS system to 20 major hospitals in the country in the near future. With the introduction of PACS, digital radiography assumes a very important place in Radiology in Sri Lanka. Digital radiology is expensive. Therefore, in the back drop of financial constrains it is necessary to look towards establishing computed radiography which is also a filmless mode of technology. The College is of the view that while digital radiography should be the benchmark, we should at least provide computed radiography units to all relevant hospitals manned by consultant radiologists while obtaining digital radiography units which is superior to computed radiography for all the teaching and district general hospitals. We believe that implementing a PACS system for Sri Lanka as a whole will address the inequity issues in human resources and equipment.

Evidence tells us that the service of the radiologists is inevitable in the provision of excellent Radiological care. This can be achieved by reaching **academic excellence** by educating residents, fellows and medical students, post graduate training and by establishing University Departments of Radiology. I am proud to say that the first ever Department of Radiology in a University in Sri Lanka was established in 2012 at the Faculty of Medicine, University of Peradeniya.

Excellence in research is achieved by the SLCR supporting innovative and clinical research. Workshops to promote research are organized and conducted by the SLCR, PGIM and the Department

of Radiology, University of Peradeniya. Research and audits have been included as a mandatory requirement in the post MD curriculum. The Annual Academic Sessions provides opportunities for presentation of innovative ideas, research and other academic activities. The positive impact of such opportunities is evident by the increasing number of free papers presented in the last few years.

To support our theme of the year, we have begun an exciting programme that provides individuals and teams of various categories, the knowledge and skills to further improve the radiological care. The aim of the "Achieving Excellence Programme" is to focus on what is best for our patients. During the course of the year the council has organized Continuing radiology education programs to enhance the knowledge and skills in Radiology among different categories of people. Public, public health workers were educated by conducting island wide programs in all nine provinces on breast cancer imaging, targeting the international day of Radiology. Another vision of SLCR is to implement mammography centred services to women of Sri Lanka. During my tenure as the president, six educational programs were organized to educate fellows and residents. A pre congress work shop was conducted for Radiographers to improve the quality of medical imaging. I am grateful to all resource persons for their contribution towards making this program a success.

The current council has submitted proposals to the Ministry of Health for radiologist cadre, required equipment and manpower, projected up to 2025. Posting a consultant radiologist, a highly trained professional to a department without the necessary equipment is meaningless. In view of this fact SLCR has identified minimum requirements for a station for the appointment of a Consultant Radiologist. The aim of the college of radiologists is to produce competent Radiologists in general radiology and sub specialties and to have at least one Radiologist per imaging modality per hospital in Sri Lanka. The equitable distribution of expertise has to be ensured to deliver island wide Radiological services. We must make a transition from being the invisible doctor to a valued and recognized member of the patient care team.

Ultimately, achieving excellence is about helping all staff to develop a sustainable way of working that encourages teams to continually improve every day. We want to make sure that everything that we do for patients is done so in the best possible way with absolute commitment to patient care as priority. At this juncture I would like to remind our college the moto to "Enlighten and relieve".

I have no doubt that the future generations of flag bearers would do their utmost to take the SLCR to greater heights in order to ensure that it is one of the foremost professional bodies in Sri Lanka".
